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Political Pulse of District Lahore

The Center for Public Opinion Research (CPOR) presenting the latest public perception of voters of Lahore district in the wake of elections 2024. Among many questions asked about key issues, political affiliations, voting intentions and awareness of political campaigns. Following are some of the interesting findings of the survey.

- 42% of the respondents identified Sui gas as the single most important issue of their Mohalla, Area or City. 15% of the respondents said that Sewerage, while 12% said Clean Drinking Water is the single most important issue facing their Mohalla, Area or city.
- When asked whom would you blame for the issue, Majority 23% blamed previous PTI Government, 18% blamed PMLN led coalition government while 17% blamed both the previous PTI government and PMLN led coalition government for the issue.
- When asked how would you rate following political personalities as a person, majority 63% said they strongly or somewhat like Nawaz Sharif, 57% said Shahbaz Sharif and 45% said they strongly or somewhat like Imran Khan as a person. However, 33% said Pervez Elahi and 21% said they strongly or somewhat like Bilawal Bhutto Zardari.
- Majority 46% of the respondents said that they will vote for PMLN during the upcoming general elections, while 29% said PTI and 7% said they will vote for TLP in upcoming general elections.
- When asked in your opinion who should be the next Chief Minister of Punjab after elections, Majority 34% said Shahbaz Sharif, 11% said Chaudhary Pervaiz Elahi, while 4% respondents said that Aleem Khan should be the next Chief Minister of Punjab.
- When asked, in your opinion which party's candidate should be Prime Minister after 2024 National Assembly elections? 47% of the respondents said that PMLN's candidate should be the Prime Minister, while 29% said the PTI's candidate should be the Prime Minister.
- Responding to the question of which political party has contacted you for the vote the majority 84% of the respondents said that No party has contacted them for the vote.

This survey report is based on the opinions of 1,005 respondents who were interviewed from December 5, 2023 to December 15, 2023. The Error Margin $\pm/-3\%$, at 95percent confidence Level.

NOTE: Surveys and polls are a good way to judge the larger public opinion and this tool is extensively used in West to get a feel of the subject. The information in this report has been compiled in accordance with international standards for market and social research methodologies.
