

#### Central Punjab District Locations





### **Survey Methodology**



To conduct a political survey of Central Punjab districts with 1,012 respondents, the following methodology was implemented:

**Sample Design**: A representative sample of the Central Punjab district's population was selected using **stratified sampling techniques**. This ensures that the sample is diverse and accurately represents the demographic characteristics of the Central Punjab.



A comprehensive questionnaire was developed, covering various aspects of political preferences and opinions. The questions included topics such as party affiliations, voting intentions, key issues, and awareness of political campaigns.


**Survey Questionnaire** 

From each location, a cluster of 10 successful interviews were conducted.

Respondent Selection:
Age 18+ & Registered Voter of sampled area.

After collecting the survey data, it was organized and analyzed using appropriate statistical analysis techniques. This involved aggregating the responses, conducting frequency distributions, cross-tabulations, and potentially applying statistical tests to identify significant patterns and relationships within the data.

## <u>Detailed Survey</u> <u>Methodology</u>

- Questionnaire Design: A comprehensive questionnaire was developed, covering various aspects of political preferences and opinions. The questions included topics such as party affiliations, voting intentions, key issues, satisfaction with current representatives, and awareness of political campaigns.
- **Pre-testing:** Prior to administering the survey, the questionnaire was pre-tested on a small group of individuals from the sampled locations to identify any potential issues with clarity, understanding, or response options. Necessary revisions were made based on the feedback received.
- **Data Collection:** The survey was conducted through a face-to-face interview method. Efforts were made to ensure a high response rate and to reach out to a diverse cross-section of the Sampled location's population.
- **Data Analysis:** After collecting the survey data, it was organized and analyzed using appropriate statistical analysis techniques. This involved aggregating the responses, conducting frequency distributions, cross-tabulations, and potentially applying statistical tests to identify significant patterns and relationships within the data.




#### **Executive Summary**


This is the second survey of series of polls presenting the latest public perception of the voters of Central Punjab. Among many questions asked about key issues, political affiliations, voting intentions and awareness of political campaigns. Following are some of the interesting findings of the survey.

- > 29% of the respondents identified Sui gas as the single most important issue of their Mohalla, Area or City. 21% of the respondents said that Sewerage, while 11% said Brocken Roads is the single most important issue facing their Mohalla, Area or city.
- > When asked whom would you blame for the issue, Majority 33% blamed previous PTI Government, 29% blamed PMLN led coalition government while 20% blamed both the previous PTI government and PMLN led coalition government for the issue.
- ➤ When asked how would you rate following political personalities as a person, majority 55% said they strongly or somewhat like Nawaz Sharif, 50% said Shahbaz Sharif and 49% said they strongly or somewhat like Imran Khan as a person. However, 34% said Pervez Elahi and 23% said they strongly or somewhat like Bilawal Bhutto Zardari.
- ➤ Majority 41% of the respondents said that they will vote for PMLN during the upcoming general elections, while 34% said PTI and 7% said they will vote for TLP in upcoming general elections.
- > When asked in your opinion who should be the next Chief Minister of Punjab after elections, Majority 37% said Shahbaz Sharif, 28% said Chaudhary Pervaiz Elahi, while 5% respondents said that Aleem Khan should be the next Chief Minister of Punjab.
- ➤ When asked, in your opinion which party's candidate should be Prime Minister after 2024 National Assembly elections? 42% of the respondents said that PMLN's candidate should be the Prime Minister, while 36% said the PTI's candidate should be the Prime Minister.
- > Responding to the question of which political party has contacted you for the vote, it is interesting to note that the general elections are around the corner and the majority 59% of the respondents said that No party has contacted them for the Vote.




#### What is your age group?











Q: In your opinion, what is the single most important issue facing your mohalla, area or city?






Q: Who do you blame more for this Issue/ problem?




Q: Thinking now about the following people, would you say that you like or dislike them as a person? And would that be strongly or somewhat like/dislike?




Q: Thinking now about the following people, would you say that you like or dislike them as a person? And would that be strongly or somewhat like/dislike?











Q: Thinking more about the upcoming general elections, in your opinion which political party's candidate should be the next Prime Minister?







